POST ADMISSION POLICY (Memorial Day – Labor Day 2026)

Once again in 2026, from Memorial Day (May 25th) through Labor Day (September 7th), Mason-Dixon VFW Post 7234 will enforce a restricted Post Admission Policy to ensure our Veterans are prioritized for entry. This is a 15 – week period. All Members shall show their valid VFW Membership Card upon entry to the Door Monitors.

- Only VFW, VFW Auxiliary, and Mason-Dixon Members in Good Standing, as well as Active Military Members will be allowed entry to the Post (with up to three (3) Guests per Member). Any Guest accompanying a VFW Member, is required to sign in on our Guest Book. This includes VFW and VFW Auxiliary Members from other Posts, who are likewise required to sign in on our Guest Book.
- All Members seeking entry to the Post shall be prepared to show their current, proper, up-to-date VFW Membership Identification Card either at the entry door, or when asked by a Post Employee or Post Member.
- All personnel entering Post 7234 shall comply with our Canteen Rules, Regulations and Code of Conduct. Members are responsible for their Guests.
- Members of the American Legion (including Auxiliary, Sons of the American Legion, etc.), Vietnam Veterans Association (VVA), Disabled American Veterans (DAV), American Veterans (AMVETS), and other Veterans Organizations are restricted from entry until after Labor Day (unless they are one of the three Guests allowed with each Member).
- If you are an eligible Veteran, or an immediate relative of an eligible Veteran, we encourage you to join our Post. Applications are provided on our website (vfw7234.org), or get hard copies just inside our front door.

End-of-life planning with the VA

April 27, 2023

VA offers programs to assist with end-of-life planning and help ease the burden on family members when a Veteran passes.



Life insurance and dependent support

Life insurance provides important financial support to family members when a Veteran dies. [Veterans Affairs Life Insurance \(VALife\)](#) recently opened for enrollment and provides guaranteed acceptance whole life insurance coverage for more service-connected Veterans than ever before. Veterans age 80 or under with any level of service-connected disability rating (0-100%) can [apply](#) for up to \$40,000 and there is no time limit to apply. Veterans age 81 or older may also qualify for Vaile if they meet additional eligibility criteria.

With Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI), you may keep your term life insurance coverage up to \$500,000 after you leave the military for as long as you continue to pay the premiums.

Loss of income can greatly affect a family's financial stability when a Veteran passes. [Dependency and Indemnity Compensation \(DIC\)](#) provides monthly tax-free compensation to eligible survivors. Family members who may be eligible include the surviving spouse, child or parent of a Veteran or service member who died from a service-related injury or illness.

Advance care planning

Different people want different things when it comes to their health care. Advance care planning ensures that Veterans' loved ones and health care teams know what's important to Veterans and what their preferences are for health care in the future. There are different types of advance care planning, and health care teams can help determine which type is right for each individual Veteran. The VHA [Advance Care Planning via Group Visits Program](#) allows Veterans and their caregivers to join their peers and learn more about the process of planning for future health care needs.

A [series of animated stories](#) highlights why advance care planning is important for everyone—whether healthy or ill, young or old, receiving health care in a clinic, hospital or at home.

Burial and memorial benefits

VA provides several benefits and services to help ease the burden of a Veteran's passing—all at no cost to the Veteran and their family. Burial and memorial benefits include opening and closing of the grave in a [national cemetery](#), grave liner (vault), perpetual care and

maintenance, a government [headstone, marker, or medallion](#) for any eligible Veteran buried anywhere in the world, a [Presidential Memorial Certificate](#), a [Veterans Legacy Memorial \(VLM\)](#) page, [burial flag](#) and military honors.

VA provides burial benefits for all legal burial types, including cremation and burial at sea.

VA oversees 155 national cemeteries and assists Veterans and family members in burial planning ahead of time through pre-need eligibility. Veterans and dependents can submit an [application](#) before death to determine their eligibility for burial in a VA National Cemetery. Veterans, service members and eligible dependents do not need to be buried in a national cemetery to receive [VA memorial benefits](#).

Additionally, VA [partners](#) with states, territories and tribes by providing grants to help fund 121 Veteran cemeteries, increasing the reach of VA's burial benefit for Veterans and their eligible family members. Eligibility for burial in these cemeteries is like VA national cemeteries but may include residency requirements.

Planning ahead

VA encourages all Veterans and family members to get educated about the benefits and services they are eligible for with regard to end-of-life planning. Planning for the future and having difficult discussions now can provide a small bit of respite for survivors when a loved one passes.

I also recommend reading "[***When Some Dies***](#)" The Practical Guide to the Logistics of Death by Scott Taylor Smith with Michael Castleman now. This book addresses many questions that should be addressed before someone dies. It is available on Amazon.

FACTS YOU MAY NOT KNOW:

The VFW Post 7234 Honor Guard was established in the late 1950s shortly after the Mason-Dixon Post 7234 was established. It continues in service today with twenty-one members. It serves as a dedicated unit performing solemn precise military funeral honors and ceremonial duties.

Our Post is an Honor Guard.

There is a distinct difference between an Honor Guard and a Color Guard. Every Honor Guard is also a Color Guard. Color Guards are NOT Honor Guards as their duties and responsibilities are limited. A Color Guard will carry the colors, post the colors and march in parades.

Our Post is an Honor Guard!!!

Honor Guards are known for their precision and attention to detail. They perform a variety of ceremonial duties, including:

***Presenting and guarding the colors (national, state, and organizational flags)**

***Rendering honors, such as presenting arms, saluting, volley and taps at funerals or memorial services**

***Providing escort services for dignitaries or fallen comrades**

***Participating in parades, change of command ceremonies, and other official events**

***Posting and retiring colors**

Each month our Post recognizes a member of our Honor Guard for his dedicated service to VFW Post 7234 and for his commitment to honor our deceased comrades. This month we recognize Honor Guard member Keith “Doc” Hnilicka.



Doc is an active member of VFW Post 7234 Auxiliary and has been a member of the Honor Guard since 2020. Doc's dad served in the Navy on the USS Des Moines in the Mediterranean during the Korean War. He states:

“That had a massive impact on me. It really sparked my interest in the Honor Guard! Hearing his stories, and my own volunteer work with the VFW, (Chicken Shack, Auxiliary events) has made me a huge fan of supporting veterans and making sure we never forget their service.”

Here, I am reminded of this beautiful inspirational letter from Major Sullivan Ballou, serving with the 2nd Rhode Island Regiment in the Civil War, to his wife Sarah before he was killed in action in 1861.

If it is necessary that I should fall on the battlefield for my country, I am ready. I have no misgivings about, or lack of confidence in, the cause in which I am engaged, and my courage does not halt or falter. I know how strongly American civilization now leans upon the triumph of government, and how great a debt we owe to those who went before us through the blood and suffering of the Revolution, and I am willing, perfectly willing, to lay down all my joys in this life to help maintain this government, and to pay that debt. . . . Sarah, my love for you is deathless. It seems to bind me with mighty cables, that nothing but Omnipotence can break; and yet my love of county comes over me like a strong wind, and bears me irresistibly on with all those chains to the battlefield. The memories of all the blissful moments I have spent with you come crowding over me, and I feel most deeply grateful to God and you, that I have enjoyed them so long.

I can't add anything to Sullivan Ballou's example this Memorial Day. Looking at the calendar for May again, here are some dates to keep in mind in addition to all the events on the Post calendar.
