SERVICE OFFICER OUTREACH

VA's Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) Program helps disabled Veterans

VA's [Specially Adapted Housing \(SAH\) program](#) helps Veterans with disabilities, including those



with spinal cord injuries and degenerative conditions, such as Parkinson's and Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS).

Created in 1948, the SAH program administers grant funding to eligible Veterans and service members with certain severe, service-connected disabilities, such as the loss of use of a limb, loss of limb or blindness. The grant program helps disabled Veterans to buy or build a permanent home to provide independent living, adapt a home they or their family member already own or adapt a home where they are temporarily living. SAH issued 2,352 grants totaling more than \$147 million in 2024.

When a Veteran's grant application is approved, the SAH team works closely with them to ensure all home improvements meet their needs. In recent years, SAH grant eligibility expanded to include Veterans with degenerative conditions that were caused or worsened by their military service. Studies show that Veterans are diagnosed at higher rates than non-Veterans with some degenerative conditions, like Parkinson's and ALS.

SAH can also be used by Veterans and service members living internationally. So, if a severely disabled Veteran applies for a SAH grant to buy, build or renovate a permanent home in Europe, Asia or anywhere else in the world, the SAH team will support them every step of the way. Currently, 48 active international cases are supported, including Veterans living in Finland and Germany. When the SAH team works on projects overseas, they often overcome foreign challenges, currency exchange rates, time zone differences and language barriers, but the team remains committed to honoring the service of these most deserving disabled Veterans and service members.

In the Philippines, one severely-disabled Veteran was recently approved for an SAH grant and the team coordinated with the home builder he selected. Throughout the construction process, they worked with the Veteran and his family to ensure the newly constructed house met all of his needs. After his new home was built, his family no longer had to carry him down two flights of stairs, and his quality of life greatly improved.

Since the program's inception 77 years ago, more than 53,500 SAH grants have been awarded, totaling \$2.2 billion. These transformative enhancements have improved thousands of Veterans' lives. These improved adaptations have increased mobility in their homes, expanded their access to community resources and enabled them to connect more with family and friends, fostering a sense of belonging and everyday normalcy in their lives.

[VA to extend caregiver support program eligibility for "legacy" Veterans, caregivers](#)

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs today announced that it will soon propose a rule to extend Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers eligibility for certain Veterans and their family caregivers through Sept. 30, 2028.

The new rule will extend program eligibility for legacy participants, legacy applicants and their family caregivers for three years while VA continues [the rulemaking process](#) to refine the program. The extension will ensure that legacy participants and applicants can maintain their benefits and stability during this time.

Legacy participants are Veterans, service members, and their family caregivers who were participating in PCAFC as of Sept. 30, 2020, and legacy applicants are Veterans, servicemembers, and their family caregivers who applied for PCAFC before Oct. 1, 2020, and were accepted into the program on or after Oct. 1, 2020.

"Legacy caregivers have helped shape VA's Caregiver Support Program for many years," said VA Secretary Doug Collins. "This decision underscores VA's commitment to Veterans and caregivers across the nation and will help provide consistency and stability to nearly 15,000 legacy participants for years to come."

PCAFC is part of VA's broader [Caregiver Support Program](#), and offers enhanced clinical support for family caregivers of eligible Veterans who incurred or aggravated a serious injury in the line of duty, and meet other eligibility criteria. PCAFC benefits include education and training, respite care, counseling, technical support, a monthly stipend and access to health care through the [Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs](#) and certain travel expenses

Each month our Post recognizes a member of our Honor Guard for his dedicated service and commitment to honor our deceased comrades and to VFW Post 7234. This month we recognize Honor Guard member **DAVID HOLDEN**.

REMINDERS AND CHANGES TO THE MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL PRACTICES

REMINDERS

AS YOU MAY RECALL IN AUGUST 2022 THE POLICY WAS CHANGED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT NO ADVANCED PERSONAL NOTICES TO RENEW YOUR MEMBERSHIP WOULD BE SENT OUT.

THE POLICY CHANGES ALSO MADE IT CLEAR THAT THE MEMBER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING THEIR MEMBERSHIP CURRENT AND IN GOOD STANDING, NOT THE POST.

THE POLICY ALSO STATES THAT MASON DIXON MEMBERSHIP CARDS WILL NOT BE MAILED. MEMBERSHIP CARDS ARE TO BE PICKED UP AT THE POST (AT THE BAR).

NEW CHANGE EFFECTIVE AUGUST 1, 2025

THE MASON DIXON MEMBERSHIP POLICY STATES:

“ALL RENEWALS FOR EXPIRING MEMBERSHIP MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE POST NO LATER THAN 60 DAYS FOLLOWING THE END OF THE MEMBERSHIP TERM. NO RENEWAL WILL BE PROCESSED AFTER MARCH 1, FOLLOWING THE PREVIOUS MEMBERSHIP YEAR. RENEWALS RECEIVED AFTER SUCH DATE WILL BE RETURNED WITHOUT ACTION AND MEMBERSHIP WILL BE TERMINATED.”
THE MESSAGE IS CLEAR! DO NOT LET YOUR MASON DIXON MEMBERSHIP LAPSE!!

SINCE THE EFFECTIVE DATE (08/01/2022) OF THE POLICY CHANGES, TOTAL POST MEMBERSHIP HAS GROWN TO OVER 4,600 MEMBERS. THIS IS A 1,100 MEMBER INCREASE IN LESS THAN THREE YEARS! DESPITE THE PROVISION ABOVE REGARDING RENEWALS, THE BOARD HAS ALLOWED VETERAN MASON DIXON MEMBERS TO RENEW THEIR MEMBERSHIPS EVEN IF SUBMITTED LATE. VETERAN MEMBERS WERE PERMITTED TO RE-APPLY FOR MEMBERSHIP. THIS PRACTICE WILL CEASE EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025.

THE BOARD RECENTLY UNANIMOUSLY VOTED TO CHANGE THIS PRACTICE.

BEGINNING AUGUST 1, 2025, VETERAN MASON DIXON MEMBERS WILL BE PERMITTED TO RENEW ONLY ONCE AFTER THEIR FIRST LATE RENEWAL. VETERAN MASON DIXON MEMBERS WHO HAVE ALREADY RE-APPLIED PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE WILL BE GIVEN ONE MORE OPPORTUNITY. THIS IS BEING ALLOWED ONLY BECAUSE THE BOARD VOTE JUST OCCURRED AND THE CHANGE HAD NOT BEEN COMMUNICATED UNTIL NOW.

IN ADDITION, THE LATE VETERAN (ONLY) RE-APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED NOT ONLY BY THE \$150 DUES, BUT ALSO A \$25 PENALTY FEE (FOR BEING LATE). THEREAFTER, IF THE VETERAN MASON DIXON MEMBER DOES NOT TIMELY PAY THEIR DUES AGAIN, THE VETERAN MASON DIXON MEMBER'S MEMBERSHIP WILL BE PERMANENTLY TERMINATED.

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS

Here are a few news items from my miscellaneous file I thought you might find interesting.



An Amazing Little Seed. According to a report in The Week magazine, botanists in Israel in 2010 planted a 1000 year-old-seed found in a Judean desert cave. It has grown into a tree that is now about 10 feet tall. They believe that it is the source of a healing balm mentioned in the Bible because analysis of the tree's leaves and resin identified compounds with potential cancer-fighting properties. The news reminded me of the reference in the Bible to the power of faith the size of a tiny mustard seed. (Matthew 17:19-21). Also seemingly improbable, but don't discount the potential.

European Wine News. In another report from The Week magazine, a wine specialist (called a "sommelier," or "smeller" for short), and staffers from a consumer magazine and TV program entered a \$2.70 supermarket wine in a prestigious French wine competition, where it won a gold medal. The pranksters had renamed it "Le Chateau Columbier" and stuck a colorful new label on the bottle. The judges said it was "exceptional and very interesting," praised it for its "suave, edgy and rich palate," as well as its "clean, youthful aroma that promised a nice complexity." The question is whether it would have made a difference to the judges if they knew it was a thrift store wine. What do you think? Wine is one of the many subjects where I have to plead almost total ignorance. But I think the lesson here is: Don't get on the wine hype train. Let your taste buds decide. I'll stick with beer and water.

Connie Francis Sings "God Bless America." As reported in the Washington Post, Connie Francis, the most popular female singer in the late 1950s and early 60s, died on July 16. With other entertainers, she performed for U.S. service members in Vietnam a number of times. She recalled that during one stop, a general warned her not to sing "God Bless America," because the embittered soldiers "hated their country." Here's the rest of her memory of that time: "Without a single word, no introduction of any kind, no music of any kind, I just walked up to the microphone and sang the first four lines of the song, [when] one lone soldier stood up, put his hand over his heart, and with tears streaming down his face, began singing along with me. Then there were 100 standing, then, 1000." She said it was the greatest moment in her life of fame and acclaim in show business. What a beautiful moment for all. Rest in peace Concetta Rosa Maria Franconero. You're home with a lot of fans.

We May Be On a Suspected Spy List. A recent article in the Washington Post, reported: “If you don’t have a cell phone or a social media profile these days, that could signal you’re a spy or criminal trying to stay off the grid.” Now most people are not concerned because they have smart phones and are on their phones, the internet and social media about 18 hours a day. They’re definitely “on the grid,” whatever that is.

But the report is worrisome for those of us who have no-app flip phones (the number is growing every day) and don’t engage in any social media communication, or even check to see what’s going on. It could be a serious problem in airline travel or applying for a sensitive federal government job. I think I may be safe because my travel is limited mostly to a few restaurants and stores in our area, and I have no intention of applying for any job, sensitive or insensitive.

Still, the report is a potential threat to many. Some say it’s unconstitutional profiling, discrimination by the feds against hermits, monks, the technology challenged and those who just want to enjoy a quiet, peaceful life. Protests and class action lawsuits could be on the horizon. Let’s hope it doesn’t come to that. Just be careful out there. You could be under surveillance.

Aug. 4. The 235th birthday of the U.S. Coast Guard, first established in 1790 as the Revenue Cutter Service. Semper Paratus (Always Ready).

Aug. 14. V-J Day. The day in 1945 that Japan’s surrender in World War II was announced. The formal surrender ceremony occurred later, on September 2, 1945, on board the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay.

Aug. 16. National Airborne Day. (All the Way!)
